Congressionally Mandated Pre-separation Counseling

Family Services

The closet's PRIMARY USE is for PCS moves. 3) The Pantry helps with grocery assistance on a case by case basis. Military Family Life Counselor

The Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC) program provides non-medical short-term, situational, problem-solving counseling services to address issues that occur across the military lifestyle and help service members and their families cope with normal reactions to stressful and often adverse situations created by deployments and reintegration. MFLC provides outreach services that expand capabilities to address needs of Airmen and their families and can be a bridge to other services available on or off base. We are happy to assist you however possible so please do not hesitate to ask. **Please bring in your LES, bank statement, bills, etc. when you come in for assistance** as it will enable the staff to provide you with a more accurate assessment of your needs.

Air Force Aid Society

HQ AFAS has implemented a new On-line Emergency Assistance Application process when applying for a Standard or Falcon Loan. All Air Force Active Duty/Spouse, Retired, ANG/AF Reserves, Widow/Widower with internet access and an email address will be able to apply for AFAS assistance using the new AFAS Online Application by registering & completing the application. Once you've completed the online application, please come in to the Airman and Family Readiness Center. Bring all necessary documentation (LES, Rent receipt, Utility bill, Repair invoice, etc.) to process the application.

Dear Ms. Hawkins:

Thank you for responding to my recent email inquiry. As a retired Army JAG Colonel and someone who is long married to a military spouse, I share your assessment that many military spouses bring the exact type of work experiences, skills, and motivation that I seek for my 18-person Appeals Division staff at the PBGC. PBGC is a small independent, federal agency that insures private sector defined benefit pensions. The Secretaries of Labor, Treasury, and Commerce sit on our Board, and our office is located at 1200 K Street NW in downtown Washington, D.C., near Metro Center.

In November or December of 2016, I expect to hire at least one Appeals Analyst, GS Series 300, at the entry-level position of GS-7 or GS-9. This is an outstanding entry-level federal job with the opportunity for advancement to the grade of GS-12 in two to three years after starting employment with the PBGC. Further promotions within our team or the Agency are also available for top performers.

As we discussed, a military spouse often has the education and/or work experience to be a strong applicant for the Appeals Analyst job that I intend to advertise later this year on USAJOBS.gov. In the recent past we have tried to pre-identify individuals with strong potential for these jobs. When we identify such persons, we notify them by email prior to the job announcement being posted on USAJOBS.gov, as these jobs sometimes are only posted for a day or two. It is also possible that I could use additional hiring authorities to offer this Analyst position to a military spouse applicant without going through USAJOBS.gov process, if that person's spouse has PCSed to the National Capital Region within the last two years.

Please share copies of this memorandum and its enclosure to career counselors and other appropriate POCs in the National Capital Region. I would like any military spouses with an interest in the position to contact my office as outlined in the enclosure. The enclosure also gives a little more detail about the duties of the job and our office. If a military spouse has contacted me in the past and are still interested, that person should contact me again.

Details about Appeals Analyst Positions in the Appeals Division, PBGC

What is the PBGC? The Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation is an independent government agency that insures private sector defined benefit pension programs. Our main office is in downtown Washington, D.C., at 1200 K Street Northwest, a short walk from Metro Center.

What is the PBGC Appeals Board? The 18-member Appeals Board staff, called the Appeals Division, writes final agency decisions on appeals by participants (our customers) who are dissatisfied or believe an error was made in how PBGC calculated their pension benefit. We decide about 400-500 appeals annually. Our staff consists of one Administrative Assistant, nine Appeals Analysts, two Board Actuaries, five Board Members, and a Manager.

Will the Board be Hiring in 2016? Yes. As Manager, I expect to have at least one opening for an Appeals Analysts in late 2016.

What does an Analyst do and what are the critical skills: An Appeals Analyst investigates a case, gathers information and prepares a proposed draft decision for consideration by a Board Member. Analytical skills, sound reasoning, and the ability to write well are key skills for our Analysts.

What are the Advancement Opportunities as an Analyst? The Appeals Analyst position is an excellent job that starts at the GS-7 or GS-9 level and automatically increases annually (assuming satisfactory performance) to the GS-12 level. Once in the Appeals Division, there are also promotion opportunities after that for promotion to GS-13, GS-14, and finally GS-15 within our Division and the Agency for top performers. For example, one of the key GS-15 Division Managers in another PBGC Department started with PBGC as an Appeals Analyst.

How does the Appeals Board Advertise its Openings? PBGC jobs are normally advertised on USAJOBS.gov. PBGC also takes advantage of certain special hiring authorities that do not require posting on USAJOBS.gov. As Manager, I sometimes limit the job posting to the time period required to obtain 200 applicants; sometimes this means a job is only advertised for one or two days.

What to do if you are interested in an Appeals Analyst Position: We will add your name and email address to a list we keep of individuals interested in future hiring actions. I will also consider whether you qualify for any special hiring authorities.
